Trade Restrictions Between India and Pakistan

Dear Customer,

At Maersk, we are committed to providing you with the highest level of service as well as relevant information you need to make important decisions about your supply chain. Thus, we are writing to inform you about the recent directives issued by the Govt of Pakistan that restricts the movement of cargo between Pakistan and India.

The government of Pakistan has imposed following restrictions with regards to trade to/from India:

- Indian-flagged vessels are not permitted to call Pakistani ports.
- Prohibition of exports and imports to and from India.
- No Indian cargo to be discharged in transit to other destinations.

(Above restriction is not applicable on vessels carrying cargo/freight remaining on-Board (RoB) originating from or destined for India.)

As a global integrated logistics company operating in a vast global network that connects both countries, we are actively engaging with stake holders to assess the operational impact and ensure full compliance to these new regulations.

While our vessels continue to call on ports in Pakistan without any interruption, we are implementing necessary adjustments to our network and routings to comply with the regulations. In this connection our **Mawingu** service will omit calling at Port Qasim in Pakistan and instead, vessel Seaspan Calicanto will carry the cargo to Salalah for the next three weeks.

All other services remain unchanged and continue calling ports in Pakistan as per their schedules.
